

The Wonder of Christmas

As a young child Christmas was a time of great anticipation. Much of the anticipation revolved around what gifts we would receive. I and my siblings would carefully examine our gifts hidden beneath the festive colored wrapping paper under the tree. Along with observing a gift's size and shape, we would pick it up to feel how heavy the package was, and sometimes shaking it for clues as to what might be inside. The mystery surrounding the gift added to its wonderment.

The wonder of Christmas has grown stronger as the years fly by. In an age when Amazon Prime can have most items delivered to our doors in two days, the wonderment revolves much less around "the gifts" of Christmas than "the Gift" of Christmas. The wonderment of why God would love me. With a heart prone to wander and with all my sin, why would God love me? Why would God love me so much He would send His one and only Son, His unique Son to die in my place for my sins?

This wonder revolves around the essence of our Christian faith. The answer to our question lies in the very nature of God Himself, His love for us. The wonder of God's love finds its fullest expression in the coming of Christ on our behalf.

As I think of the wonder of Christmas, I'm reminded of the wonder the young virgin Mary surely felt. Imagine her wonder and amazement as the angel came to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you.' 29 Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. 30 But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. 31 You will conceive and give birth to a Son, and you are to call Him Jesus. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David, 33 and He will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; His kingdom will never end.' 34 'How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, 'since I am a virgin?' 35 The angel answered, 'The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy One to be born will be called the Son of God. 36 Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. 37 For no word from God will ever fail'" (Luke 1:28-37 NIV).

Imagine the wonder Mary felt! She was going to bear the Messiah, and this would be a virgin birth!

Mary displays her faith in God's Word as she responds, "I am the Lord's servant, may your word to me be fulfilled" (Luke 1:38).

And so it was. Mary experienced the wonderment of this Child conceived by the Holy Spirit growing inside the veil of her body. She felt His kicks within her womb.

Probably seeking moral support, as well as perhaps safety, Mary traveled to the Judean hill country around Jerusalem to visit her elderly cousin Elizabeth. Together, these two shared the wonderment of being pregnant—one too old and one a virgin. One to give birth to John the Baptizer, the other to Jesus, the Messiah.

When Mary entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth, Elizabeth felt her baby leap in her womb. Then Elizabeth filled with the Holy Spirit exclaimed in a loud voice: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the Child you will bear! 43 But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45 Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill His promises to her!" (Luke 1:42b-45 NIV).

Have you ever wondered if your unborn child can feel? Here John the Baptizer leaps for joy as he hears the voice of the mother of the Messiah. John, who would go on to serve as the forerunner preparing the way for the Messiah, even now through God's Spirit knows this is a joyous occasion.

Through Elizabeth, God affirms to Mary what Gabriel the angel has told her. Mary's response shows the wonder she felt at this privilege of bearing the Messiah. "My soul glorifies the Lord 47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, 48 for He has been mindful of the humble state of His servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, 49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is His name. 50 His mercy extends to those who fear Him, from generation to generation" (Luke 1:46b-50 NIV).



Adult non-fiction: Jesus





prayers of strangers...but also those of her own heart. Great reading!


CALVARY'S CHRISTMAS Celebration

Elder Express


Charles Dickens " A Christmas Carol" is one of the most beloved Christmas stories of all time. The tale of a miserly, miserable old man who considers Christmas humbug is magically transported to his past, his present, and finally his future to see how he got to be where he is. In the end, Ebenezer Scrooge embraces the Christmas spirit and comes to agreement with Tiny Tim: "God bless us one and all!" However, a more appropriate story which we rarely see at Christmas time is Mark Twain's novel The Prince and the Pauper. The story of two boys, the one a son of royalty, the other a son of poverty whose paths cross, and fascinated by each other's life, and their uncanny resemblance, decide to switch clothes, and lives, temporarily. Tom tries to cope with court customs and manners. Edward experiences the brutish life of a pauper first hand. In the end, the boys assume their former identities, each gaining a greater appreciation for the lot of the other. God's Word says in Galatians 4:4-5 "When the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons." God's Son left glory and became as we are in order to reconcile us back to God through His sacrificial death on the cross. The King of Glory taking our place. Now that's a Christmas story!
